Three-tier prescription drug list that splits medications into three categories (or tiers)

TIER I Generic medications have the same strength and active ingredients as the brand name, but often cost much less. Customers will pay less for generic medications under a three-tier program. If one is available, customers should consider switching to a generic to treat their condition.

TIER 2 Preferred brand medications usually cost more than generics, but may cost less than a non-preferred brand on a three-tier plan.

TIER 3 Non-preferred brand medications generally have generic alternatives and/or one or more preferred brand options within the same drug class. Customers will usually pay more for non-preferred medications on a three-tier plan.



To see what medications are covered, you can view the Cigna Healthcare drug list on <u>Cigna.com/druglist</u>. Select '**Performance 3 Tier**' from the drug list drop-down menu.

Quantity Limits

For some medications, your plan only covers up to a certain amount over a certain length of time. For example, your plan may only cover 30 mg a day for 30 days of a certain medication. Examples of medications that may have quantity limits are those that are often taken in amounts larger than, or for longer than, appropriate or medications that are often misused or abused. Your plan will only cover a larger amount if your doctor's office requests and receives approval from Cigna Healthcare. You can find medications that have quantity limits on the Cigna Healthcare Prescription Drug List (select 'Performance 3 Tier'). Just look for a 'QL' next to the medication name.

Prior Authorization

Some medications on your drug list require prior authorization. This means that you need to get approval from Cigna Healthcare to receive coverage under the pharmacy benefit plan. If you're taking one of those medications, your provider can ask Cigna Healthcare to consider approving coverage of your medication. If you don't get approval, the medication may not be covered. You can find medications that require a prior authorization on the Cigna Healthcare Prescription Drug List (select 'Performance 3 Tier'). Just look for a 'PA' next to the medication name.

Step Therapy

The Cigna Healthcare Pharmacy Step Therapy program promotes the use of generic drugs and lower-cost, brand-name alternatives, while avoiding disruption for the customer at the pharmacy, and providing customers and their physicians the flexibility to use brand-name drugs when medically necessary.

Our Step Therapy program is different because it takes a "pay and educate" approach. The customer may fill their high-cost prescription one time at the pharmacy. After that first fill, Cigna Healthcare notifies the patient and the health care professional that the patient must try a lower cost, equally effective medication before the higher-cost medication will continue to be covered.

The health care professional is also provided a prior authorization form to submit if the customer must stay on the higher-cost drug. This softer approach allows the customer to get started on a medication right away, and then discuss the switch with their doctor. Medications that are part of the Step Therapy program have 'ST' next to the medication on the drug list. You can find medications that require Step Therapy on the Cigna Healthcare Prescription Drug List (select 'Performance 3 Tier').

Dispense as Written (DAW)

With DAW, the customer may have to pay the difference. If a customer receives a brand name drug when there is a generic equivalent available, the customer will pay the brand copay, coinsurance, and/or deductible, plus the cost difference between the brand and generic drug. However, if the prescribing physician indicates "Dispense as Written/ DAW" on the prescription, the penalty does not apply, and the brand copay or coinsurance applies.

Online Support for Home Delivery

Connect to the Express Scripts online account portal with a link directly from Cigna Envoy®. The portal offers the opportunity to:

If your plan provides coverage for certain prescription drugs with no cost-share, customers may be required to use an in-network pharmacy to fill the prescription. If customers use a pharmacy that does not participate in your plan's network, the prescription may not be covered, or reimbursement may be limited by your plan's copay, coinsurance or deductible requirements.

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
